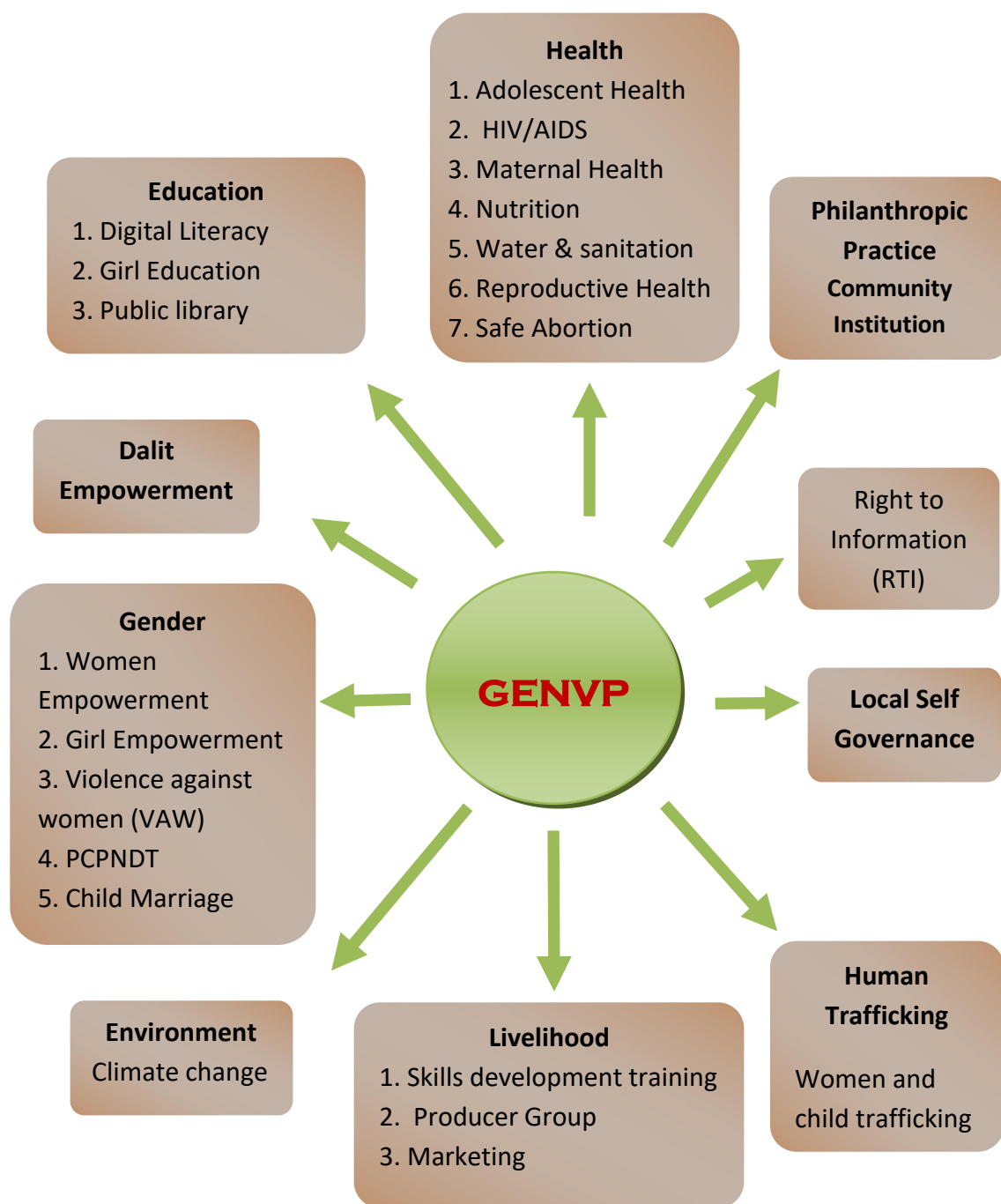

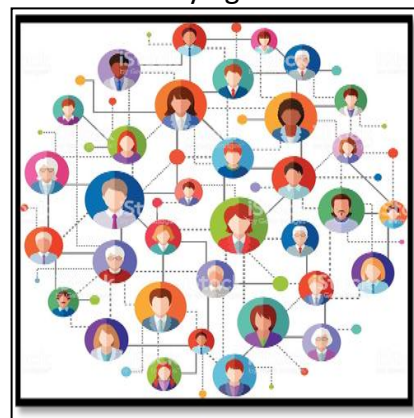
GENVP has worked directly in Patna and Nalanda Districts of Bihar and throughout Bihar State through the network and indirect interventions.

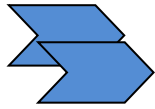

The best method to overcome these limitations and thereby achieve the state-wide spread as well as wide spread impact, is through networking of similar organizations. This effort has yielded fruit in bringing together a many civil society organizations spread all over Bihar. Repeated rounds of network meetings among them have finally brought about an understanding of common principles a commonly agreed minimum action plan. 1. PUBLIC HEALTH

1.1. TO SUPPORT VULNERABLE DALIT COMMUNITIES IN BIHAR FOLLOWING THE SECOND WAVE OF COVID-19

The Corona Virus (COVID-19) pandemic is both a health crisis and an economic crisis. A key response on the health front has been a lockdown and restrictions on activities to contain the spread of the virus. However, a lockdown also means an economic shutdown with the decimation of work, livelihoods and incomes for the vast majority of people. The corona virus pandemic has triggered a massive reverse migration from the “destination” to “source” in large parts of the country. We witness that thousands of laborers marching back to their villages in order to find some warmth and empathy more than anything else, as the rest is going to be too hard to come by. Bihar state is also one of the most affected states of India during the corona virus pandemic.

GENVP with the support of **Global Fund for Community Foundation (GFCF)** conducted a Covid-19 response initiative activities to support the poorest and most vulnerable people to overcome the economic and social crises especially “Dalit” communities from 1st **July 2021 to 31st December 2021 in Nalanda District of Bihar.** The initiative helped to address the severe problems faced by the families with respect to health, nutrition, stress, mental health, personal protection, acute crisis, profound fear, frustration and other social and familiar issues in the wake of the second wave of Corona Virus Pandemic. The initiative promoted mass awareness on Covid-19 disease and its prevention strategies, strengthened the community support systems that enable poor families to access the government schemes. It also supported vulnerable families especially Dalit Community with food kits, medical kit, nourishment to children, adolescents, and pregnant/lactating mothers. The frontline workers of Dalit Community Foundation and the community volunteers were also at risk and the initiative was taken to protect them, ensure safety protocols and to provide highly essential support to them whenever it became necessary.

KEY OBJECTIVE:

1. To provide immediate support to poorest and vulnerable people to overcome the economic and social crisis due to Corona Virus pandemic.
2. To strengthen the community support system
3. To promote mass awareness on Covid-19 disease and its prevention strategies
4. To provide food and medical kits
5. To provide training for community volunteer and other front-line worker and ensure safety protocol of covid-19.

The main task of the initiative was that timely act in providing food and necessary medicines as well as other materials to approximately 450 families who had lost all their means for livelihoods. Along with packed dry ration for these families the organization also provided masks, sanitizer, and medical kits (covid-19 Survival Kit items) for their daily use. The program directly reached and reduced the risk and vulnerabilities of approximately 200 community volunteers and frontline community workers who though were facing the highest risk but were not supported or protected in any means. Details of immediate support items are shown in below table:

Outcomes:

- Reach out 450 Dalit and Ultra-Poor families and provided emergency support to them.
- Enrolled 1000 community members in E-Shram Portal of the government for availing immediate livelihood opportunities especially for migrant workers.
- Facilitated the missing families to get linked with Public Distribution System and employment schemes like MGNREGS.
- Community volunteers were provided technical knowledge on spreading awareness on home based precautionary measures for preventing covid-19.
- The trained volunteers from the community were nurtured who keep on providing counselling support to a large number of families through personal visits as well as telephonic counselling.
- Volunteers of this program were linked with government run vaccination program.



1.2. COVID-19 VACCINATION PROJECT

COVID-19 pandemic is a global challenge that has infected and caused the loss of many lives nationwide and worldwide. Social distancing, outdoor movement restrictions, avoiding social gatherings, and speedy mass vaccination are observed to be the only way to contain and defeat this mammoth pandemic. COVID-19 vaccination is found to be the most effective step to reducing its spread and associated deaths among the people and resuming life normalcy.

To support the Covid-19 vaccination drive program of the PHC Parwalpur, Gramin Evam Nagar Vikas Parishad (GENVP) was implemented Covid-19 vaccination project with the support of the Ajim Premji Foundation at Parwalpur Block, Nalanda District of Bihar from 18th October 2021 to 23rd April 2022.

GOAL OF THE PROJECT:

100% Vaccination

OBJECTIVES:

1. To find out the 18 years above unvaccinated population at Parwalpur block.
2. To understand the beneficiaries' problem/reasons for not participating in the government vaccination programs.
3. To ensure that all eligible groups receive the vaccine with confidence.
4. To deliver correct information about the COVID19 vaccine and ensure they are not mis communicated or influenced by myths and misconceptions.
5. To address the hesitancy of COVID-19 vaccination among the beneficiaries.
6. To provide correct, consistent and, timely information on the COVID-19 vaccine (availability, safety, and timelines) and vaccination processes.

About the Project location:

Parwalpur is a Block in Nalanda District of Bihar state. According to 2011 census of India, total Parwalpur block population is 70,316, of which 36,686 are male and 33,630 are female. The town is about 15km from Bihar Sharif and about 15km from Ekangarsarai. Under the Parwalpur block there are 23 revenue villages and one town, these all villages fall under the 6 Panchayats (1. Shivanagar, 2. Chausanda, 3. Pilich, 4. Alawa, Mai and Sankardih Panchayats)

Activities carried out under the project:

For successfully implementation of the project the following activities were delivered under the Covid-19 Vaccination project:

❖ Household Survey:

Carried out house to house visit activities and collected information by using the prescribed format and VaxIT mobile application by trained staffs. Under this survey, there were collected total residents of 50157 data and out of them found total eligible people are 38704 and 34909 migrated



resident's data in the Parwalpur Block. The survey was conducted from 1st November 2021 to 31st March 2022 and covered entire Parwalpur block.

❖ TRAINING:

Training gives every staff a great understanding of their responsibilities as well as the knowledge and skills that they need to apply in their job. This will enhance their confidence which can also improve their overall performance. Under this project various training program was conducted for fulfilling the achievement of the project.

✓ **Training on Covid-19 and vaccination program:**

Entire team was gone through the various training on Corona Virus and Covid-19 vaccination program provided by the MOIC Parwalpur and GENVP core team. Understanding of the Corona virus and its prevention mechanism is mandatory for all working staff in this project. GENVP core team with the support of MOIC Parwalpur PHC has conducted regular capacity training for all staffs.



✓ **VaxIT Application:**

Entire program team was gone through the Vaxit Mobile application training. The VaxIT application is for facilitating localized Covid-19 vaccination. This mobile application is developed by the Ajim Premji Foundation to perform following tasks.

i. **Resident Registration:**

Registration of all ages resident in the block along with household details.

ii. **Vaccination status:**

Based on schedule of doses, vaccination status of Resident can updated from not vaccinated to partially vaccinated and partially vaccinated to fully vaccinated.

iii. **Reporting and Planning:**

List of Residents based on upcoming due date and overdue date can queried for planning vaccination camps as per capture data in the application.



To understand the scenario of Covid-19 vaccination status and develop vaccination strategies in the Parwalpur Block, GENVP has conducted a survey of entire block by using VaxiT application.

❖ **Health Mela:**

Supporting in combating Corona Pandemic, GENVP team has participated in Ayushman Bharat Block health Mela organized by Parwalpur PHC at Parwalpur Block. The GENVP Parwalpur team has opened a covid-19 vaccination stall during the health Mela and facilitates the covid-19 testing and vaccination activities.



❖ **Vaccination Camp:**

112 vaccination camps were organized at different location/Villages of the Parwalpur block. In conducting these vaccination camps, a series of community mobilization activities was carried out at entire block. Trained volunteers and community mobilizers provide counseling for detach the myth of covid-19 vaccine among the beneficiaries and provided information on necessary required documents for vaccination. Conducted interviewed of the beneficiaries during the survey and find out the real issues/reasons for not participating in covid-19 vaccination session and also sort out the issue of beneficiaries with the support of PHC and PRI members by GENVP field team.



❖ **Mobile awareness and IEC distribution:**

Shri Ram Kishor Prasad Singh (General Secretary, GENVP) and Dr. Nalnish (MOIC Parwalpur) launched the Mobile Awareness and IEC distribution Campaign program as on 7th Feb. 2022 from PHC Parwalpur campus. The campaign of Covid-19 vaccination mobile awareness and distributes of IEC material was done at entire villages of Panchayats of Parwalpur block



with the aim of eradicating myths and vaccine hesitancy among the beneficiaries. As a outcome of the campaign many refusal beneficiaries were able to convince and vaccinated.

Outcomes of the Project:

- Successfully conducted household survey of entire block and collected total 50157 residents' data and out of them found total eligible people are 38704 and 34909 migrated resident's data in the Parwalpur Block.
- Identified the issues of not accepting Covid-19 Vaccine among the beneficiaries and address the issues through providing accurate and appropriate information. As a result, community members were contributing their support in vaccination camp and door to door vaccination program.
- Capacitated Skills and knowledge of volunteers from the community through providing training and education on Covid-19 vaccination and safety protocol. The skilled volunteer were done the counseling and awareness to own community for providing accurate and appropriate information on Covid-19 vaccination as a result many refusal beneficiaries are able to vaccinate.
- 112 vaccination camps were organized at different location of the Parwalpur

block and able to vaccinate 99% of community member who are above 18 years of age currently residing in the block.

- During the Covid-19 crisis period project has able to provide short term job to community members.
- Entire volunteer were linkage with various government schemes.
- Increased covid-19 vaccination awareness level among the community member due to conducting rigorous vaccination awareness campaign at entire block.
- Community mobilizers were got the recognition and appreciation from Medical Officer In-charge, PHC- Parwalpur for their dedicated hard work on covid-19 vaccination drive.
- Established good connection between government health system and community.

SUCCESS STORIES:

1. Vaccination of Pregnant woman:

26 years old Priyanka Kumari has been residing in the Karn Bigha Village of Pilich



Panchayat, Parwalpur Block of Nalanda District. She was the 5 months pregnant and only one daughter in-law in the family. It is her first-time pregnancy after marriage. Santosh Kumar is the husband of Priyanka Devi working in Gujarat. She has been living under the guidance of her in-laws. Her in-laws and husband was very happy for her pregnancy of after 5 years of marriage and they are carefully taken care of her health.

Priyanka Devi was met during the household survey of the Covid-19 Vaccination program at the Karnbigha village by Ms. Ganita Devi, Volunteer of GENVP. Ganita Devi came to know that Priyanka Kumari is not vaccinated due to her in-laws refusal. Her In-laws saying that covid-19 vaccine may harm to her baby and they

don't want to take any risk. Whenever Ganita try to convince her in-laws, they directly denied and said that she will take the vaccine after delivery of her baby. Volunteer Ganita was continuously visited her home whenever come across her village.

A few days later, Ganita Kumari again visit Priyanka Kumari home and this time she shared information on pregnant woman from the neighboring village who have already taken vaccination to her In-laws. She managed to call the pregnant women and request to share her experiences regarding vaccination and its benefits. Through the phone call, the Vaccinated women shared the merit and demerit of getting the Vaccine to Priyanka Kumari's in-laws. She also shares the problem of not vaccinated when the time of admitting in the hospital for delivery. Adding to information share by vaccinated women Ganita also shares her experience regarding benefit of taking the vaccine to them. Finally, Usha Devi in-laws were agreeing to vaccinate her. She was taken 1st dose of vaccine as on 10th November 2021 and second dose were taken as on 31st Jan 2022. Now Usha Devi has a baby boy and both are safe and healthy. After the successful vaccination of Priyanka Kumari other pregnant women residing in Pilich village are also started taking Covid-19 vaccination.

नालंदा। कोविड-19 की वैश्विक महामारी की भयावहता को देखते हुए आम समुदाय को कोरोना संक्रमण से बचाने हेतु ग्रामीण एवं नगर विकास परिषद स्वयंसेवी संस्था द्वारा परवलपुर प्रखंड में प्राथमिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र के साथ मिलकर टीकाकरण जागरूकता अभियान का कार्यक्रम चलाया जा रहा है। इस अभियान का मुख्य उद्देश्य वैसे प्रत्येक व्यक्ति को कोविड-19 टीकाकरण करवाना है, जो किसी भी कारण से टीका लेने से वंचित है। इसके लिए संस्था के स्वयंसेवकों की टीम गांव गांव में जाकर प्रत्येक घर के एक - एक व्यक्तियों से मिलकर कोविड-19 का टीका लेने का आग्रह कर रही है। ग्रामीणों को टीका लेने के लिए प्रेरित करने के साथ - साथ टीकाकरण से जुड़े हुए गलत धारितियों को भी दूर करने का काम स्वयंसेवकों द्वारा किया जा रहा है। इसी क्रम में ग्रामीण एवं नगर विकास परिषद और प्राथमिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र परवलपुर के संयुक्त तत्वाधान में जन जन तक कोविड-19 टीकाकरण के सूचना, टीकाकरण से होनेवाले लाभ की जानकारी देने हेतु आज जागरूकता रथ को रवाना किया गया। इस जागरूकता रथ को ग्रामीण एवं नगर विकास परिषद के महासचिव राजकिशोर प्रसाद सिंह एवं प्राथमिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र परवलपुर के चिकित्सा प्रभारी डा. नलनिश ने हरी झंडी दिखाकर रवाना किया। यह जागरूकता रथ लगातार गांव - गांव जाकर लोगों को कोविड-19 से बचाव हेतु उपायों तथा टीकाकरण की सूचनाओं का प्रचार-प्रसार करती रहेगी। इस अवसर पर ग्रामीण एवं नगर विकास परिषद के महासचिव राजकिशोर प्रसाद सिंह ने लोगों से कोविड-19 का टीका लेने के लिए अपील करते हुए कार्यक्रम का उद्देश्य एवं इसके लिए संस्था द्वारा किये जा रहे प्रयासों से अवगत कराया। इन्होंने बताया कि टीके का दोनो खोज लेना, सामाजिक दूरी बनाए रखना, मास्क का नियमित प्रयोग करना, खाली या छीकते समय रुग्ण का प्रयोग करना एवं हाथों को सैनिटाइज करना या साबुन से बार बार धोने का संदेश भी दिया। Dr. नलनिश ने अपने संबोधन में कहा कि ग्रामीण एवं नगर विकास परिषद के द्वारा किया जा रहा प्रयास काफी सराहनीय है और प्रखंड के टीकाकरण के उपलब्धता की हासिल करने में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका रही है। इन प्रयासों का समुदाय में इसका काफी असर पड़ रहा है। इन्होंने लोगों को बताया कि कोरोना का टीका गर्भवती महिला एवं जो महिला बच्चे को दूध पिला रही है उनके लिए भी लाभकारी है, उनके बच्चे पर इसका कोई बुरा असर नहीं पड़ता है। लोगों में धारित है कि जो महिला बच्चे को दूध पिलाती है, उसे बैक्टीरिया लेने के बाद उसका असर मा के दूध के जरिये बच्चे पर पड़ता है। जो कि सरासर गलत है। सभी गर्भवती महिलाओं को भी प्राथमिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र द्वारा आयोजित कोविड-19 टीकाकरण अभियान में टीके लेने के लिए बताया। इस अवसर पर संस्थान की वरीय पदाधिकारी श्रीमती अंजू किन्हा ने लोगों को संबोधित करते हुए अपील की कि जो लोग टीका ले चुके हैं, वे आस-पास के लोगों को भी टीका लेने के लिये प्रेरित करें क्योंकि कोविड-19 का संक्रमण एक दुसरे से फैलता है और टीकाकरण मानव शरीर के इम्युनिटी को मजबूत बनाता है। इन्होंने बताया कि टीकाकरण ही कोविड-19 के तीव्र लहर में लोगों को खतरे से बाहर रखने में मददगार साबित हुआ है। इस आयोजन को सफल बनाने में इरम गुणाचंद्र सिंह, ऋषभ अच्युतम के साथ संस्थान की पूरी टीम एवं प्राथमिक स्वास्थ्य केंद्र परवलपुर के बी.एच.एम. सत्यम शिवम, बी.सी.एम. संजय कुमार एवं अन्य कार्यकर्ताओं की सक्रिय भागीदारी रही।

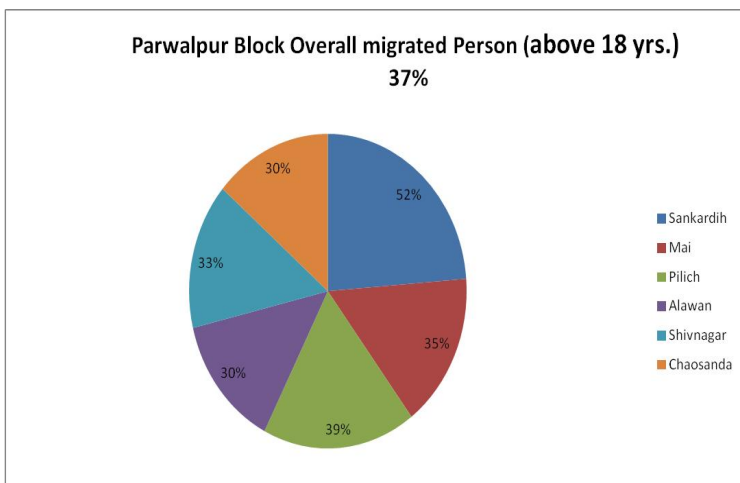

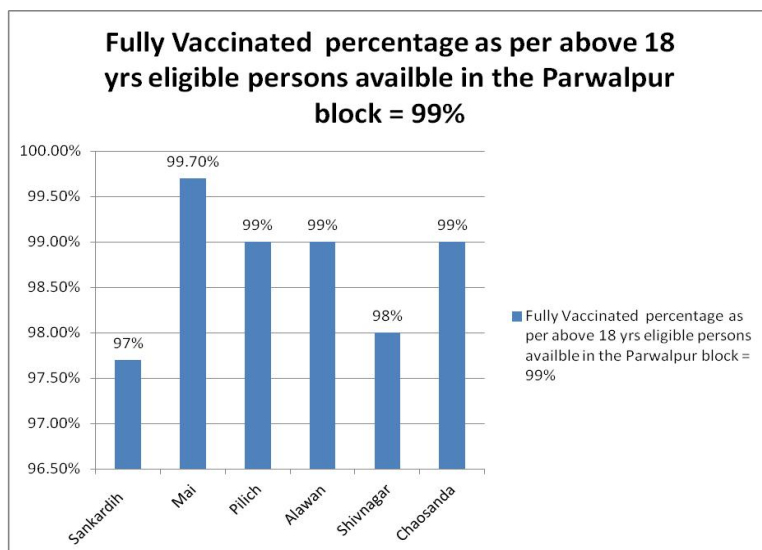
Percentage distribution of above 18 age of migrated population of Parwalpur Block

2. LIVELIHOOD Program

2.1 'LIGHTING LIVES'

CANDLE PRODUCTION AND MARKETING PROJECT FOR SUSTAINING THE REHABILITATION OF BEGGARS/ULTRA POOR

The project aims to provide employment opportunities and income for at least 90 people from the most marginalized and poorest sections of society. When this project reaches scale, 90 direct beneficiaries and 500 indirect beneficiaries are expected to receive health and other socio-economic benefits in the form of dependents of the direct beneficiaries. Maximum profits would be made by the people involved in candle manufacturing and marketing. The overall goal of the project is to generate socio-economic benefits by providing livelihood opportunities. The project has been running since 2017.

INTRODUCTION:

India is a country of festivals and we light lots of candles during the festival of lights the 'Deepawali'. 'Candles' are still a necessary item in the purchase lists of every family whether urban or rural all over India. Especially in the low income and poorest states such as Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, the use and demand for candles are very high. There are various small cottage-based production units which are majorly the producers and suppliers to the entire candle market demand. There is lot of opportunity for employment, income enhancement and institutional as well as



socio-economic growth enshrined in the production and marketing sphere of candles in these states. The supply side of the market for candles is far from saturation.

Gramin Evam Nagar Vikas Parishad in collaboration with **Lemonaid+ Charitea foundation** is using this opportunity to establish a unique innovation of **Candle Production and Marketing units** to provide the sustainable income to the target groups i.e. beggars/ultra-poor in culture capital district Nalanda of Bihar State.

This project has established 90 Candle Production units till 2021 which provide direct employment to 90 beggars/ultra-poor and indirect employment to at least 500 persons in the form of dependants of candle



producers. The ultimate objective of establishing livelihood project is to engage beggars/ultra-poor to improve their quality of life in context of health, education and other socio-economic benefits.

Objectives:

1. Formation of 90s Candle Units (CBO) and provide direct employment to 90s beggars/ultra-poor and indirect employment to at least 500 persons in the form of dependants.
2. The direct full-time employees who are stakeholders in the production and marketing of Candles shall earn at least INR 8000 per month.
3. The Socio-Economic conditions of the dependants of the directly employed persons in the project shall improve substantially compared to the pre-project times where they had very little or nil income.
4. The direct beneficiaries shall benefit from sustainable income and thereby prevent their relapse into social evils like beggary, petty thefts, prostitution etc.

5. Socio-Economic Empowerment of the direct beneficiaries as a result of the Membership Based Organization being formed among them and through the training and capacity building events planned as part of the project
6. To ensure dignified life for beggars/ultra-poor.

OUTCOME:

1. A total no. Of 75 candle units (CBO) has formed. All the 75 units are led by ultra poor persons assisted by their family members or the nearest community members.
2. Rehabilitate 75 ultra-poor & providing direct full-time employments.
3. The direct beneficiaries are able to get income between Rs. 4000 to Rs. 8000 per month.
4. 325 family's members are directly benefiting from the project and their family members have been oriented and vaccinated against COVID 19. The project has provided regular employment of 325 beneficiaries hailing from the Ultra-Poor sections and rehabilitated beggars.
5. All the targeted family members were oriented towards the uptake of health benefits from various government programmes.
6. Provided training to 82 youth from the beneficiary families on employable skills specially focusing on local marketing of the candles, managerial capacities for sustaining candle production units etc.
7. 500 family's members with at least one member were trained on formation of producer group, operation of the candle producer groups and institutional processes leading to sustainability.
8. More than 200 youth have been trained through the project.
9. Established linkage with Local Self Governance, District level Governance Institutions and State Government Bodies to include the project in their livelihood enhancement plans.

2.2. NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FOR COMPREHENSIVE REHABILITATION OF PEOPLE CURRENTLY ENGAGED IN BEGGING IN PATNA (BIHAR)

In association with State Society for Ultra Poor and Social Welfare (SSUPSW), SAKSHAM, Social Welfare Dept. Govt. of Bihar, GENVP is implementing the National Campaign for Comprehensive Rehabilitation of People Currently Engaged in Begging in Patna Town of Bihar State from **September 2020**.

INTRODUCTION:

State Society for Ultra-poor and Social Welfare has been implementing non-custodial rehabilitation scheme for the beggar under “Mukhyamantri Bhikshavriti Nivaran Yojna” (MBNY) in 10 districts. Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, has taken notice of aforesaid Scheme and in this regards series of consultation were held under the aegis of Ministry to understand “issues to eradicate Beggary” and the way forward across country. The team of Ministry had studied MBNY Model and is keen to take draw attention from the on-going Scheme in developing National Campaign for the Rehabilitation of Beggars across country. Government of India has proposed to launch a National Campaign in the line of MBNY Bihar Model in 10 cities of India (including Patna) for **Comprehensive rehabilitation of people currently engaged in begging in first phase**. Further, SSUPSW (Saksham) has been nominated by the DoSW, Bihar as Nodal Agency for implanting of National Campaign for "Comprehensive Rehabilitation of people currently engaged in Begging" in Patna.

Goal: The overall goal of the campaign is to Eradicate Beggary and rehabilitates beggars through providing alternative livelihood option.

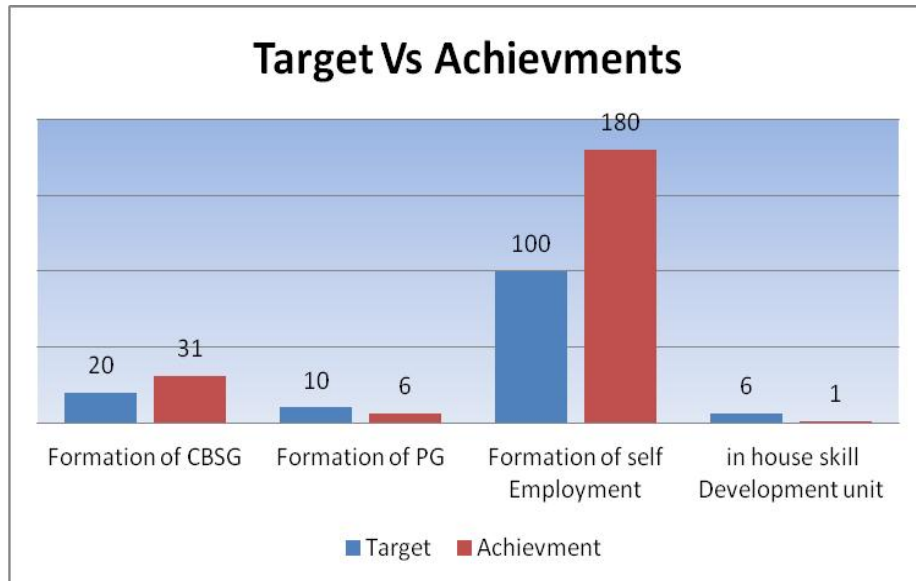
Objectives:

- To create an enabling environment to ensure equal opportunities, equity, social justice & empowerment of beggars.
- To encourage voluntary action and participation of all stake holders for ensuring effective implementation of the scheme.
- To expand outreach activities for rehabilitation of beggars and create facilities for providing identity & appropriate rehabilitation services.
- To promote individual and group initiatives by beggars for employment, self-employment, and other socio-educational services.
- To facilitate care of children of beggars including leprosy affected persons and encourage mainstreaming of their daughters/sons.
- To strengthen the existing implementation machinery and create facilities for coverage of all uncovered areas of the state for ensuring complete coverage of beggars.
- To provide necessary care, support and shelter to old, disabled & sick people into beggary
- To generate awareness in public to discourage beggary

It shown that formation of Community based saving group (CBSG) and self employment has achieved higher than the target and formation of producer group (PG) and establishing of in house skill development unit has lower than the target.

OUTCOME:

- **Formation of Community Based Saving Group (CBSG):**

31 Community based saving group were form under this program. They are engaging in various livelihood activities.

- **Formation of Producer group (PG):** 6 producer group has from. This group has headed



by the beggar community members who has rehabilitate from beggary life. This producer group running the small scale industry like, broom making, sleeper making, Agarbatti making, Papad making etc.

- **Self Employment:**

Under the National Campaign program there were able to make 180 nos. self employment. These beneficiaries has taken grant from the government schemes and running their own shop like, vegetable selling on thela at road side, Shoes polish, tea stall, etc instead of begging activities.

- **Establishment of in house skill Development unit:**

Establishment of in house Skill Development Unit is very challengeable since entire beneficiaries are have psychological problem and unstable nature, Even though there was established one in house Skill Development unit at Shanti Kutir Named "Annapurna Swadist vyanjan Apporti Samooh" and also completed A.O.P during the reporting period.

- **Linkage with Bank:** Saving Bank accounts has opened for all individuals beneficiaries.

3. AWARENESS GENERATION PROGRAM

Community awareness program help to educate the community about specific issues occurring in the society. The aim of the conducting awareness program is that to bring issue to the forefront of dialogue, alter social consciousness, and encourage people to change their actions. Whatever the Awareness program, it may be helpful to join forces with other anti violence advocate, allied movement, and community base organization in order to reach more people and have a greater impact public opinion and actions. We believe that awareness + action with bring the positive change in the society. During the FY 2021-22 GENVP has conduct various Awareness program in Nalanda district of Bihar State as continuation activities of FY 2020-21, the details are as follows:

➤ **Awareness on Domestic violence during Covid-19 Pandemic:**

Domestic violence is one of the most pernicious gendered ailments of our society. GENVP has experienced that domestic violence cases are increased in rural areas of Bihar state during the first phase of covid-19 pandemic and many unreported cases are still unsolved and lying on the ground. GENVP continuously supporting to women and girls from marginalized communities and also provides “legal and psychological counseling” to victims of domestic violence. During the covid-19 Pandemic (Second Phase), GENVP conducted awareness programs on domestic violence in rural areas of Nalanda district on preventing domestic violence against women

and girls. Through this awareness campaign GENVP able reached more than 5000 families. The GENVP outreach worker has provided the free counseling to victim



of domestic violence and also facilitated in providing legal free service to them. Organized village level meeting cum awareness program as an important activity of this awareness campaign. During the awareness campaign our ORWs interacted many women who are victims of domestic violence and which is not reported and still lying inside the society. Providing awareness and education to the community member toward the consequences of domestic violence in the society lead them to change their behavior and approach. The main objective of the program is to educate community members, youth and change their attitude and behaviour to bring equality in the society. This act is the first step in preventing domestic violence in our society and many more need to do.

➤ **Awareness on Family Planning during Covid-19 Pandemic:**

If couples plan their families properly, they make small families which lead to healthy lifestyles. They have less, but robust children. These children have a better education, nutrition as well as health care facilities provided by the government through family welfare measures. Family planning makes it possible for women to be healthier and have more equal opportunities to pursue an education, a career, and financial security.

The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly impacted women's access to essential

health services. The inability of women to exercise their reproductive choice; inadequate availability of and access to family planning and reproductive



health services; and regressive social norms which prevent women from accessing and negotiating contraception were problems well before the COVID-19 pandemic. These have been exacerbated during the pandemic. There is an overwhelming majority of Indians living in villages with stereotype attitude. Many of these people are ignorant, conservative, and uneducated. Their actions are deeply rooted in the traditions and customs that have existed for a very long time and are not ready to give up on these practices.

During the Covid-19 pandemic period GENVP conducted the awareness program on Family Planning and provide the counseling to couple's families, young couples residing in Nalanda district of Bihar State. GENVP has organized various outreach programs where invite the maximum number of couples and make sure them to participate in the program.

Through program, Couple and their families are aware that how important family planning is and where to access government family planning services. GENVP

were able to reach the 5000 couple's families and facilitated on the access of health care facilities provided by the government through family welfare measures.

➤ **Awareness on Stop Child marriage during Covid-19 Pandemic:**

Even before the COVID-19 pandemic, no. of child marriage very high in Bihar State and the state has the highest rate of child marriage in India. The pandemic has increased poverty levels and hunger, and decreased access to education, the risk of girls becoming child brides is also increasing. Girls who marry in childhood face immediate and lifelong consequences. They are more likely to experience domestic violence and less likely to remain in school. Child marriage increases the risk of early and unplanned pregnancy, in turn increasing the risk of maternal complications and mortality. The practice can also isolate girls from family and friends and exclude them from participating in their communities, taking a heavy toll on their mental health and well-being.

In Nalanda District of Bihar, GENVP has taken the step of using a multi-stakeholder approach in which local officials and community



members are activated for empowering the girl child through providing awareness, counseling along with their parent and creating barriers to early marriage. During the awareness campaign GENVP team member provides Information of child helpline no. 1098 and importance of preventing child marriage in society were informed to the children and their families. GENVP was able to reach 5000 of family's connections to prevent of child marriage during the Covid-19 pandemic.
